## Alberton Cemetery

Alberton Cemetery is located on two hectares. The land was set aside in 1872. The site is owned and operated by the City of Gold Coast.

**Location:** Zipf's Road, Alberton  
(exit 34 off Pacific Motorway)

### Burials

- Monumental sites
- Natural burial area

### Earliest recorded burial

- A German migrant with the surname of Voigt was buried in 1886.
- Earlier burials took place in the cemetery when a group of German migrant families settled in the area.
- The cemetery also contains a number of unknown locations of burials. In 2003, a memorial was erected in the cemetery to commemorate names of the unknown burials.

## Pimpama Cemetery

Pimpama Cemetery is located on 4.4 hectares. The land was set aside in 1872 and is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee. This cemetery is well known for the war memorial monument erected within its precinct.

**Location:** 100 Creek Street, Pimpama  
(exit 45 off Pacific Motorway)

### Burials

- Monumental sites

### Ashes memorials

- Columbarium wall – single and double niches

### Earliest recorded burial

- Francis Lahey was buried in 1878.

## Lower Coomera Cemetery

The one hectare Coomera Cemetery was gazetted in 1881 and is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee.

**Location:** 5 Cemetery Road, Coomera  
(exit 54 off Pacific Motorway)

### Burials

- Monumental and Lawn Beam sites
- Islamic section

### Ashes memorials

- Columbarium wall – single niches only

### Earliest recorded burial

- William Wilson was buried in 1867.

## Upper Coomera Cemetery

The 4.5 hectare cemetery is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee. The land was surveyed for cemetery use in 1871.

**Location:** Saville Road, Upper Coomera

### Burials

- Monumental sites

### Ashes memorials

- Ashes memorial garden – single and double sites

### Earliest recorded burial

- Catherine Hardgraves, aged four months, was buried in March 1885.

## Southport General Cemetery

The 4.2 hectare cemetery was gazetted on 16 July 1880. It is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee. Some of the earliest recorded graves pre-date 1880 suggesting the area had been an unofficial burial ground for early European settlers.

The cemetery is located on Queen Street which was the original route to the earliest wharf located on the Broadwater at Southport.

**Location:** 237 Queen Street, Southport

### Burials

- Monumental sites – General, infant, Jewish, Islamic, Orthodox and vault sections

### Ashes memorials

- Ashes memorial rose garden – single, double and family sites

### Earliest recorded burial

- A male pensioner known as Joab who was killed by lightning was buried in 1878.

## Southport Lawn Cemetery

The 4.84 hectare cemetery is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee.

**Location:** Melia Court, Southport

### Burials

- Lawn and lawn beam sites
- Children and infant lawn beam sections

### Ashes memorials

- Ashes memorial garden – single and double sites
- Infant/children memorial garden – single sites only
- Columbarium wall – single, double and triple niches
- Granite columbarium wall – single niches only

### Earliest recorded burial

- The cemetery's first burial took place on 21 May 1970.

## Nerang Cemetery

Nerang Cemetery is located on one hectare. The land was set aside in 1878. It is controlled and operated by the City of Gold Coast as trustee.

**Location:** 21 Mylor Street, Nerang

### Burials

- Monumental and lawn sites

### Ashes memorials

- Columbarium wall – single niches only

### Earliest recorded burial

- Lucy Ann Cockerill, aged four years, was buried 28 June 1876.

## Mudgeeraba Cemetery

Mudgeeraba Cemetery is owned and operated by the City of Gold Coast. The lower part (0.75 hectares) was donated to the city by the Laver family in 1936. The city also acquired additional land for cemetery use and the cemetery now encompasses a total of 9.5 hectares. A portion of this land has been utilised for a monumental lawn beam section and provides an additional 680 burial sites and a number of ashes memorial sites.

**Location:** 307 Mudgeeraba Road, Mudgeeraba (exit 39 off Pacific Motorway)

### Burials

- Lawn and monumental lawn beam sites available for purchase
- Monumental sites are limited

### Ashes memorials

- Columbarium wall (lower section) – single and double niches
- Granite columbarium wall (top section) – single niches only
- Ashes gardens – single, double and family sites

### Earliest recorded burial

- William Henry Laver was buried in 1936.
